AutoMODIFIED has another leased Open Drifting event on August 31. Experienced and first-time drivers are welcome. Spectator tickets are \$5, youth 12 and under are free. \$20 pit passes (driver pit passes are \$80 and include one crew member). Ride-a-longs are possible with a pit pass!! Drifting events are rain or shine (spectators sit under the skyboxes to stay dry). Ticket and pit windows open at noon. Tech runs at 1:00 and the track is hot from 2-9 PM.

Let's get right to it! It was great to have sprint cars back at the Zoo!



Ryan Huggler took fast time (13.959, 96.712 MPH) in the Kenyon Midget Series. Despite the Midget label, these self-starting Sprints are pretty peppy. Huggler went on to win his heat while Clayton Gaines won the second heat. Both drivers skipped Victory Lane. In the 2D lap feature, 13 Midgets vied for the checkered flag. In the end it was Ryan Huggler sweeping the night. Clayton Gaines was the runner-up and Evan Hammond placed third.

In the Auto Value 500 Sprint Car Tour, Tyler Roahrig was at the top of the leaderboard in single car qualifying. Roahrig's lap time was 13.021 (103.679 MPH). Aaron Pierce continues to hold both the winged and nonwing records at Kalamazoo Speedway. Tyler Roahrig won the 50-lap feature. In the runner-up position was Kody Swanson and Jake Trainor pulled out his place on the podium with a third place finish.

In the Spartan Insulation Front Wheel Drive DOT class, 4J Trucking sponsored handsome purses for the A, B & C features. Corey Woods was the fastest in the practice session with a time of 16.366. Gunner Gale had the fastest time of the 40 who qualified, clocking a 16.234 (83.159 MPH).

The 15-lap 'C' feature was won by Steve Thomson (right center) paying

out \$150 to win. Jeff Phibbs was the runner-up (far right) and Cayden Verburg placed third. Bailey Pauwels won the 15-lap 'B' feature taking home the \$250 to win feature money. Zach Bozell was the runner-up and Brianna Brady made another trip to Victory Lane, taking the final spot on the podium.

In the 'A' feature, people were on the edge of their seat wondering (hoping!?) that one of the top three would have their car claimed! Everyone left with the car they brought and no one was disqualified (except for breaking out). In the 25lap, \$1,000 to win feature, Landen Deplanche took the early lead before Austin McKee drove to the head of the pack and then broke out. That left Colin Bozell with the lead for a few laps before Jorden Brinkert took a turn at the head of the pack. Then it was Spencer Wortinger to the lead; one he didn't give up. At the checkered it was Wortinger, Corey Woods and Gunner Gale. Colin Bozell finished fourth followed by Jorden Brinkert, Dillon Rose, John Gonzales, Jeremiah Bouma, Christina Rantz and Desmond Watkins. This was a non-point race.

> And that leaves the Techworks Trailers Street Stock and their 4J sponsored \$2,000 to win 'A' feature. Kyle VanSparrentak was the fastest in the 33-car field in practice (15.050). Brock Ganus was the fastest qualifier (14.770, 91.401 MPH). Blake Hybels won the 20-lap 'B'

feature and the \$500 that went with the win. He started at the tail of the 13 car field and moved into the lead with four laps remaining. Tyler May was the runner-up and Patrick Kirkendall placed third.

In the 'A' feature, Alex Sexton took the early lead before the race was stopped due to a brutal crash in Turn 1. A couple of cars made contact going into turn 1 resulting in Nick Pressler being turned and another car slamming into him. Thankfully both drivers were OK. When the race resumed, Sexton again took the lead, though it was short-lived. Tyler Hufford moved to the lead. With 22 laps remaining, Kyle Ribble moved to the head of the pack. Ricky LaDuke was in the runner-up position with Brock Ganus pushing hard. Ganus made it around LaDuke and Ribble and Ganus battled for multiple laps. With three laps remaining, Ganus took the lead and when the checkered flag was waved it was Brock Ganus with the win, Kyle Ribble in the runner-up position and Ricky LaDuke finishing third. Andrew Rutherford followed with Kyle VanSparrentak rounding out the top five. Jeff Town led off the second half of the order, Logan Maynard was next followed by Alex Sexton, Jeremy Young and Tyler Hufford, all finishing on the lead lap. Defending champion Kyle VanSparrentak is the point leader by a comfortable margin over Alex Sexton (-217).
