

### JULY 26, 2024: RACING RECAP.

The Street Stock, both Front Wheel Drive classes and the Vintage Modifieds joined the 4J Modifieds on Friday night. Tonight was the first night that the break out time for all classes moved to 0.2 seconds. The Michigan Auto Racing Fan Club was on hand and presented Gary Howe with recognition for his sportsmanship, support of the track and his decades of dedication. On behalf of the track, Gary Howe and Barb Fisher accepted a Certificate of Appreciation from the MARFC President for the track's continued service and support.



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For those of you who missed the Friday night races, we've included a few highlights.

#### Front Wheel Drive - DOT

It was a \$500 to win night for the

DOT's. Gunner Gale made an early run at proving his mettle with a fast time of 16.239 (83.133 MPH). Bo Brady (right), Hanna Zwart (below) and Steve Thomson (right) won the heat races.



Bri Brady (below) won the 15-lap 'B' feature. Jacob Montgomery-Froelich (below right) was the runner-up followed by Josh Forney (below right), Travis Petto, Steve Thomson, Ethan Emerson and Bryson Beebe. Two other drivers broke out and were disqualified.



The 'A' feature had a rough start with multiple cautions leaving the field down by about a third when all was said and done with that unfortunate phase. Drew Hosner led the race until almost the halfway point and then departed the race, running in the top five, with only a handful of laps remaining. Jorden Brinkert, having broken out in his heat, moved into the lead position close to the halfway point. Gunner Gale and Scott Elsey were making their moves and Desmond Watkins, having started in 14<sup>th</sup>, moved into the top five. At the checkered it was Jorden Brinkert with his first feature win on of the year. The runner-up position went to Gunner Gale with point leader Scott Elsey medaling in third place. Desmond Watkins was fourth followed by Brandon Chadwick and Bo Brady. Finishing down a lap or more it was Hannah Zwart, Drew Hosner, Austin McKee and Duane Green III rounding out the top 10. Scott Elsey holds a comfortable lead in the points over Dillon Rose (-173) and Desmond Watkins (-190).

#### Front Wheel Drive - Outlaw

If you guessed that Matthew Elsey Jr. drove to the fastest lap in qualifying,



you'd be right! He clocked a 15.211 (88.752 MPH) in qualifying and then proceeded to better that time in the feature (15.122). After missing Victory Lane for the feature last week when his car developed mechanical issues late in the race, he made up for it this week by taking one of the heat races (right) and going on to win the feature. Charles Anderson (top right) won the second heat race. Dinah Jean led the first couple of laps of the 25-lap, \$750 to win feature, and Matthew Elsey Jr., (from the 12th starting position) rocketed through the field to assume the lead shortly thereafter. Matt Elsey held third place early on but Wayne Stack and Tyler May had a bead on Victory Lane. Dave Leonard Jr., a frequent and friendly rival to Elsey Jr., finished as the runner-up. Wayne Stack medaled in third place. Tyler May earned a fourth place finish and Matt Elsey rounded out the top five. Nick Layman led off the second half of the order with Drew Hosner (-1) following, then Charles Anderson (-1), Amanda Weatherwax (-2), and Bryan Gates (-8). Matthew Elsey Jr. retains the point lead over Matt Elsey (-111) and Bryan Gates (-186).



#### Vintage Modifieds



Dave Sensiba, runner-up in Kalamazoo Klash II was the fast qualifier with a time of 15.138 (89.180 MPH) for the Vintage Modifieds. Sensiba and Larry Bryie Jr. won the heat races. Ken Quimby took the early lead in the 25-lap feature, then John Ray and Jeff Holden took a turn before Dave Sensiba (below) asserted his dominance and drove his way to another Victory Lane. Jeff Holden was the runner-up (bottom right, far right) followed by John Ray (yellow fire suit), Dave Cutler and Larry Bryie Jr., all finishing on the lead lap. Ken Quimby and Duane Debonte finished one lap down. Johnny Montgomery wrapped up his feature down two and Tyler Holmes down nine. Jared Blanchard's night ended during the practice session. We'll look forward to seeing him in a Vintage Modified the next time the series visits.



#### Street Stock

Kyle Ribble continues to get his car dialed in and was the fastest Street Stock on the property with a time of 14.835 (91.001 MPH). Blake Hybels (right) and Colin Bozell (top right) won the heat races.

The feature was arguably the best race of the night. Kyle VanSparrentak came from a sixth starting position to lead. Brock Ganus took the lead for about 5 laps before VanSparrentak took it back. Meanwhile, Kyle Ribble had worked his way through the field and challenged Van Sparrentak for a good half of the race, first on his bumper as VanSparrentak successfully blocked him. Ribble was persistent trying high and low and finally managed to gain a few feet and pull to VanSparrentak's side. And even then, VanSparrentak held on to his lead, that is, until the white flag lap when Ribble made the pass without a lot of real estate left and took the checkered flag 0.098 seconds ahead of runner-up Kyle VanSparrentak (grey shirt). Chad VanSparrentak (blue shirt) had moved into the third place early in the race and held the position for most of the race, having a front seat view of what played out in front of him. Brock Ganus was fourth followed by Blake Hybels, Alex Sexton, Madison Snyder, Mason Montgomery, Kenny Head II and Patrick Kirkendall (-1). Kyle VanSparrentak holds the point lead over Alex Sexton (-159).





#### **Modifieds**



For the Modifieds \$5000 to win 40-lap feature night, Brian Bergakker was the top

qualifier at 14.083 (95.860 MPH). The Modifieds didn't run heats, running a scuff session instead. Lon Putnam led the

first couple of laps of the feature, Matt Dimit then took over and led for more than half the rest of the race. Brian Bergakker, Matt Maurer and Jeff Ganus had all moved into striking distance. Dimit held off Bergakker lap after lap but Bergakker made it to the front with about 12 laps remaining. At the checkered it was Brian Bergakker with the win, the runner-up was Matt Dimit and Matt Maurer was third joining the other two on the podium. Jeff Ganus was fourth followed by Donny Matteson Jr., Brock Ganus and Mark Fliearman all on the lead lap. Rick Sibila (-1), Tyler Hufford (-1) and Lon Putnam (-1) wrapped up the top 10.
